LIMITED PLACES AVAILABLE ON OUTDOOR ACTIVITY & INSTRUCTOR TRAINEESHIP



Great interest has been shown, in
the Cavan and Monaghan area, in
the new Outdoor Activity
Instructor Traineeship which is
currently being offered by Cavan &
Monaghan Educational & Training
Board which is due to commence in
the new academic year.

The programme will be based at
Tanagh Outdoor Education & Training
Centre where two previous Outdoor
Activity & Instructor Traineeship courses
have been completed. Past students

from these courses have since moved
into successful employment within
Ireland, Italy, Wales, Nepal and Sweden
to name a few.

The course is a traineeship in the
area of Outdoor Activity Instructor and
will be run over 44 weeks with a
mixture of practical and theory based
subjects, with the time frame running
from end of September to the middle of
July 2016, Monday to Friday.

The programme is designed to help
people gain an understanding of

Adventure Sports and the Outdoor
sector as a whole while preparing them
for future employment/study. The
students will be supported by a
dedicated and highly experienced team
of tutors within each module, as well as
the use of modern equipment during
course time and the chance to be
training outside in a classroom with a
decent view!

The modules on offer will include;
Rescue Emergency Care level 3 (First
Aid), Mountain Skills training &
Assessment (Hillwalking),
Powerboating operations, Rock
climbing, Child Protection, Career & Job
Seeking skills, Paddle Sport Skills
(Training & Assessment), Paddle Sport
Instructor award (Training &
Assessment) and eight weeks of work
placement within one of Ireland's many
Outdoor Centres.

In addition to the above, there will
also be extra modules provided such as
the Leave No Trace trainer course and
The Mountain Leader Training Award

(Hill walking). The modules on offer
carry the full recognition of the national
governing bodies in Ireland and are
recognised both home and abroad.

Entry requirements: The
following list are necessary
requirements for the traineeship...
Applicants must have: a receipt of a
Social Welfare payment, an interest in
sports and the outdoors, a commitment
to the 44 weeks, a drive to progress to
further employment and or education.
Entry to the course is subject to
interview, physical assessment and
satisfactory Garda vetting. Available
