Monaghan County Council in conjunction with Coillte Outdoors is pleased to announce that 3 new looped walks have been developed in Dartrey Forest. The funding for the development came through the

European Union's INTERREG IVA Programme which is managed by the Special EU Programmes Body.
The Fairfield, Deerpark and Temple loops range in length from 2.1km to 7.2km and take

walkers through the forest and the surrounding area which is particularly beautiful, being com-posed of a series of lakes joined by the Dromore River.
